



2010 Northern Century NOTICE OF RACE August 27-29, 2010

1. BACKGROUND

Looking for one of the toughest distance races in the Pacific Northwest at the best time of the year - look no further! The Northern Century is sponsored by the Anacortes Yacht Club and is the club's premier distance event. 2010 will be the third running of this epic event and there will be two divisions:

- Fully crewed
- Double handed

2. RACE DESCRIPTION

The course starts in Fidalgo Bay and heads north to Point Roberts, down Boundary Passage, then south through Haro Strait to Hein Bank and returns to Anacortes with a finish off Shannon Point.

The race starts on Friday, August 27, 2009. Double-handed entries start at 1930 (GPS Time) followed by fully crewed entries at 1940 (GPS Time). It will likely take most competitors until Sunday morning to finish. This is a very difficult event that involves considerable navigational challenges, plus night sailing, strong currents, transit of vessel traffic lanes, and potentially strong winds near Hein Bank.

The race is open to all yachts that have submitted the following:

- **Completed registration on-line**
- **Paid a registration fee of \$50.00**

Winners from last year will be recognized at the banquet the evening of the race at Anacortes Yacht Club. The bar will also be open to all participants and guest persons.

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5. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 5.1 To enter the event, entrants must register by online at www.anacortesyachtclub.com and pay the appropriate fees by the registration deadline. Registration after the deadline may be accepted at the discretion of the race organizers and will require an additional late fee.
- 5.2 A boat wishing to use sails with numbers different from her own must notify the Principal Race Office (PRO) during the required skippers meeting.
- 5.3 All boat racing must ensure that her correct rating is issued and recorded by PHRF Northwest by the registration deadline or when her registration is accepted. Boats racing without a valid PHRF Northwest certificate will not be scored and her entry fee will not be refunded.
- 5.4 A change in a boat's rating will take effect on the day it is recorded by the rating agency. Changes are not retroactive.
- 5.5 A boat rated by PHRF Northwest in consideration of water ballast will be allowed to use water ballast as rated. This changes RRS 51.

6. FEES

\$50.00 if received by August 13, 2010; \$75.00 thereafter
One dinner and one event shirt included with registration

Additional dinners are \$10.00

Additional event shirts are \$20.00 (various sizes available)

7. RULES

The Regatta is a PIYA category II event and is governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2009-2012, except as they are changed by the sailing instructions or as follows:

- 7.1 The prescriptions of US Sailing to the following rules shall apply: 34, 40, 48, 55, 61.4, 64.3(b), 68, 70.5(a), 76.1, 76.3, 82, 86.3, 88.2, Appendix F, and Appendix G2
- 7.2 Boats not finishing by 16:00 on Sunday, August 29 will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF). This changes RRS 35.
- 7.3 A boat that did not start (DNC, DNS, OCS), did not finish (DNF), retired after finishing (RAF), or is disqualified (DSQ, DNE, DGM, BFD) will be scored the number of finishers plus one. This changes RRS Appendix A4.2 and A9
- 7.4 Between sunset and sunrise, the "International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea" shall replace the relevant rules of Part 2.
- 7.5 A boat that impedes or obstructs commercial traffic will be subject to disqualification.
- 7.6 Competitors are advised that while PIYA paragraph 3.16 now permits single braided UHMWPE (eg. Dyneema) rope as an alternative to stainless steel wire lifelines, RRS 49.2 continues to prohibit hiking outside upper lifelines when either lifeline is made of materials other than (stainless steel) wire.
- 7.7 No single handed entries are permitted due to US Coast Guard regulations.
- 7.8 Other changes to the rules may be noted elsewhere in the Notice of Race or the Sailing Instructions. Changes to the rules introduced in the Sailing Instructions and not identified in the Notice of Race are intended to be those changes that would not materially affect a boat's decision to enter the race, such as changes related to courses, start, finish, and protests.

8. SAFETY & RESPONSIBILITY

- 8.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority, Anacortes Yacht Club, will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. It is the responsibility of each skipper to competently inform their crew of the risks of sailboat racing, to make sure their crew understands and accepts those risks, to decide whether their crew is competent and their equipment adequate for the event, and to decide whether to start or continue in a race.
- 8.2 Boats racing must comply with the then current Pacific International Yachting Association (PIYA) Special Regulations Governing Minimum Equipment and Accommodation Standards according to the race category requirements identified in the Notice of Race. - 8.4 Boats must comply with U.S. Coast Guard regulations.
- 8.5 The race committee may inspect a boat or its equipment at any time before or after racing for compliance with safety requirements.

9. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available by the August 1 on the Anacortes Yacht Club website (www.anacortesyachtclub.com), plus printed copies will be available at the required skippers meeting.

10. SCORING & AWARDS

All scoring will be done using time-on-distance at 100 num based on elapsed times. Awards will be given to the following boats:

- First, second and third place finishers in each division
- The last boat to finish before the time limit in each division
- The boat voted by the race committee as having the most fun during the event
- Boats breaking the elapsed time records in each division

11. MOORAGE

Promotional rate moorage will be available at Cap Sante Marina at a discounted rate for Thursday through Sunday nights. Call 360-293-0694 for reservations or call VHF channel 66A between 0700 and 1700 daily. Two day advance notice is required to reserve a slip.
